The residency program is designed to develop practitioner excellence in the provision of patient-centered, evidence-based care. Our philosophy is to continually advance and pioneer the pharmacy profession with a wide variety of clinical responsibilities and duties performed daily by our pharmacy staff to improve patient care. We are currently looking to expand the clinical pharmacy services offered at our institution with the establishment of our pharmacy practice residency program. Our program emphasizes developing practical skills into the residency experience.

Program Objectives

We are committed to develop future pharmacist leaders by designing a residency program around skills we believe are essential to a promising career in various opportunities available to pharmacists today. Our residents will be competent in a variety of pharmacist's functions including clinical, operational, administrative, education and leadership roles.

Compensation and Benefits

Compensation for the first year of residency is approximately \$58,000. Benefits include full medical, dental and vision coverage as well as 14 days of vacation. Residency accommodations include their own work area and travel and registration reimbursements for residency related conferences.

Residency Requirements

The resident will have completed a Pharmacy Doctorate program from an accredited college of pharmacy and either have an intern or pharmacist licensure in California or have taken board exam by July 1 and licensure before September 2 of the residency year. The residents' schedule will include a 40-hour workweek that includes two weekends a month. There is an opportunity to staff once adequately trained. The residents will also participate in activities necessary for maintaining accreditation. Residents will also be expected to precept fourth year APPE students and attend interdisciplinary rounds held throughout the week.

How to Apply

Providence Tarzana Medical Center participates in the ASHP PhORCAS electronic application service and it is the only method of applying to our program. To be eligible, applicants must complete the following via PhORCAS no later than January 2, 2020:

- A brief essay describing the following:
 - How will PTMC's residency program help further your professional goals?
 - As a prospective resident, how can you contribute to PTMC's program?
- Official transcripts from your school of pharmacy
- A Curriculum Vitae
- Three letters of recommendation (at least one from a faculty member and one from employer) submitted directly from the recommenders via PhORCAS
- Upload a recent photograph

Personal interviews will be scheduled for the month of February through March.
